# Open Research Program [Lecture] Dominique Gonzalez-Foerster

For the third Open Research Program, *Parasophia: Kyoto International Festival of Contemporary Culture 2015* will invite French artist Dominique Gonzalez-Foerster to deliver a lecture in Kyoto. Gonzalez-Foerster is based in Paris and Rio de Janeiro, and works primarily in Europe in the fields of art, literature, architecture, cinema and more. She has drawn the attention of the art world since the 1990s with her installations and film works that present deep, tranquil contemplations of the complex relationship between images and fiction that is woven together by language.

This Open Research Program will be presented with the cooperation of the National Museum of Modern Art, Kyoto, where the exhibition *Reading Cinema, Finding Words: Art after Marcel Broodthaers* will be opening on September 7, with Gonzalez-Foerster among the exhibiting artists.

#### About the artist

#### **Dominique Gonzalez-Foerster**

Born in Strasbourg, France, 1965. Based in Paris and Rio de Janeiro. Artist residency at Villa Kujoyama (Kyoto), 1996–97. Recipient of the Marcel Duchamp Award, 2002. Exhibiting artist at the 1st Yokohama Triennale (2001), Dokumenta XI (2002), the 4th Skulptur Projekte Münster (2007), the 53rd International Art Exhibition of the Venice Biennale (2009), the 8th Biennale de Montréal (2013), etc. Solo exhibitions include NOCTURAMA\* at the Museo de Arte Contemporáneo de Castilla y León (MUSAC) (2008), TH.2058 from the Tate Modern's Unilever Series (2008), and chronotopes & dioramas at the Dia Art Foundation (2009). Her film installations are included in the collections of the National Museum of Modern Art, Kyoto (De Novo, 2009) and the 21st Century Museum of Contemporary Art, Kanazawa (Ann Lee in Anzen Zone, 2000). Most recently in Japan, Gonzalez-Foerster showed Belle comme le jour with Tristan Bera at Gallery Koyanagi, along with a screening event at Institut français du Japon (both in Tokyo, April 2013). In addition to her installations and films, Gonzalez-Foerster's wide array of activities include writing, editing for Purple Prose (which eventually evolved into the present Purple Fashion), and collaborating with Balenciaga. Over the past few years, she has staged many performances, such as K.62 and K.85 with Ari Benjamin Meyers at Performa 09 in New York (2009), T.1912 with the Wordless Music Orchestra at the Guggenheim Museum in New York (2011), "The 121st Night" with Tristan Bera (produced by Protocinema) in Istanbul (2012), T.451 with Ari Benjamin Meyers in Stockholm (2012), and the "M.2062" series at the Serpentine Gallery in London (2012), the Stedelijk Museum in Amsterdam (2013), and the Irish Museum of Modern Art in Dublin (2013). In 2012, Gonzalez-Foerster started a new performance series titled "M.2062". In this series, the artist appears in costume and delivers performances with text. Performances have been held at the Serpentine Gallery in London (*M.2062*, October 13, 2012), the Stedelijk Museum in Amsterdam (*M.2062* (*Ludwig*), January 17, 2013), and the Irish Museum of Modern Art in Dublin (*M.2062* (*The Boy with Green Hair*), June 21, 2013).
